Agility Course Fun Day

DATE: Thursday, July 30, 2015 TIME: 6-8pm WHERE: 1406 Key Street in Maumee- Lucas County Fairgrounds (not the Rec Center) - Jr, Fair Building **COST:** \$5

Bring your dogs for a fun day. Let your dog explore the agility equipment and have fun with your best friend.

Helpful hints and rules:

~ One handler per dog (human must be 14 years old or older, adult must be present with the dog but the minor can hold the leash; the adult needs to be within reach of the dog and leash).

~ Dog must remain on leash, no retractable leashes.

~ Make sure your dog's collar is snug - we advise against choker, martingale, prong or shock collars.

~ Bring yummy, smelly treats cut to the size of a pencil eraser.

~ No dog or human aggressive dogs (aggressive dogs or aggressive humans can be asked to leave).

~ You will be signing an injury release before entering.

~ Spay/neutered, up to date on vaccines, including Rabies, flea preventative (records not necessary). We advise that puppies who are not at least one week past their THIRD set of vaccines not attend.

~ Veteran dog fosters and Cheryl from Talk Dog Toledo will be on hand to help show you and your dog the ropes.

~ Set up of our Rummage Sale will be ending at 5:00. Dogs are not permitted inside of the sale building. Please be mindful of the temperature if you are thinking of volunteering at the rummage sale before your adventure at agility

Villa Is A Cat That Needs Our Help

This poor kitten is Villa. She was badly injured when struck by a vehicle at a busy intersection and left rolling in one of the lanes. A nice woman with a big heart scooped her out of the road and quickly contactedPlanned Pethood. She was transported to one of our vet clinics where it was quickly discovered that she had several serious injuries.

One of her front legs is broken at the elbow and she is unable to use it. We are hoping to save it but it may need to eventually be amputated.

But the worst of her problems were the skull injuries. She has skull fractures which caused pressure in her brain and some drooping on one side of her face. Medications are bringing the swelling down but suddenly she was developing a fever and the top of her head swelled dramatically.

The veterinarian sedated her and found one of the largest

abscesses she had ever seen on the top of little Villa's head! She lanced and cleaned it and inserted a drain to keep the pus and bacteria draining. She has endured so much in her two months of life.

We are trying to find her; and others like her; happy endings.

We are expecting to spend approximately \$1,500 trying to save her and this is a strain on our financial resources since we are caring for so many. Please contribute to her care which will help us say YES to the next one that needs us this much.

You Saved Her Life - Phoenix's Story

We got the call to see if we were available to foster a young black lab mix. "Sure, we can do that." I said. Then we hear, "well he has some special needs." "Ok, no big deal, we can handle that." "He has burns that you will need to keep clean and make sure he doesn't scratch or get infected." I've seen dogs that were burned in our program before and on the internet. We can do this! My husband wanted to name him Phoenix since he survived the burns. When I went to pick him up I was shocked to find open wounds that were blood red, hair singed on his body and face, but yet he was so darn happy to see people! He wiggled, gave kisses freely and just wanted to love you. How could a dog that has been through this

be so happy?

We brought Phoenix home and introduced him to our two dogs. He immediately blended in to our pack and was a perfect gentleman. He tolerated the "cone of shame" when he needed to wear it, he let me clean his wounds, did great at the vet, cut off the dead skin like the vet recommended, and he even let me put on essential oils to keep the wounds and surrounding skin moist so it would heal nicely.

When Phoenix was able to go to adoption events I would share his story about how he was found in a field as a stray and suffered these burns but we were not sure how he got them. Did he knock something hot over on himself, did he escape a house fire, or was this intentional?

Phoenix caught the eye of a potential adopter who was a Toledo fire fighter. She read his story and just had to meet him. She told me that her and her husband were looking for a companion since they lost their dog not too long before to old age. She kept returning to his photo and bio on the website. She completed an application and we took Phoenix over to meet them. That is when she told me that she just had to adopt him because of this connection: While at the fire station, she pulled up his picture online and was showing his picture to some of her colleagues. One of the other female fire fighters who normally works another shift happened to see it. She said, "I know that dog!" She then told the story.

She was on a fire call that was called in by the Toledo Police. A dog was burned. She reported that when the crew arrived they saw some kids running from the area and Phoenix was in the middle of the field. The police and fire department called Lucas County Canine Care and Control and they took him in for evaluation. After tending to his burns for a few weeks they deemed he was ready for transfer to a rescue (partially to avoid infection and to receive some more one on one care).

We determined that their home was perfect for Phoenix... it was fate! AND, they also adopted another Planned Pethood dog the same day so Phoenix has a new sister along with a forever mom and dad.
