Planned Pethood Rescues Home Full of Animals

It was a scene from a horror movie...or an episode of Hoarders...or a scene from a rescuer's worst nightmare!

Wall-to-wall animals. Feces. Urine. Decay. Neglect.

Jane Holman, a volunteer with Planned Pethood, had been trapping feral cats in a colony when she was approached by a concerned neighbor of a specific home, hoarding animals. She started making inquiries and trying to figure out how bad the problem was.

It was bad. Really bad. Feces everywhere. Litter boxes overflowing. Urine drenching all surfaces. Feces smeared on all surfaces. Sad eyes. And scared cats and dogs looking for a place to rest. Tired mama cats, after litter upon litter.

Jane and Karen Latta, Cat Intake Coordinator worked with all the cat fosters to see how many animals could be placed on our foster system. Sadly, the dog program had no room to take in the dogs from this sad situation. Jane was able to find another rescue to take the 2 dogs and 4 puppies.

In one day,
Jane removed 28 cats,
2 dogs and 4 puppies
from a home less than
1000 sq feet. Nine of
the cats were placed in
other rescues, leaving
19 in
the Planned Pethood
adoption program.



One foster mom, Nancy Fisher reports her foster taken from the home, Sassy is doing well. Her photo is of her having fun rolling around and hanging upside down. She is loving everything fresh and clean. Her eyes are reddened and just a little teary yet due to irritation from the constant ammonia stench in the home's air. Most of the cats, as reported by two of the vet clinics, had these eye issues that improved overnight just by being in clean air.
