## **PPI Suffers Budget Shortfall**

As we enter February, PPI is faced with having a serious budget shortfall to see us through the month. This means we have to start asking ourselves where can we make up for this shortfall.

Temporarily we are proposing to curtail our services to the public. This means less spay/neuter services. When there are thousands and thousands of cats pregnant and ready to give birth this March & April that is a scary solution.

We are also proposing to curtail how many animals we can take into our adoption program. Escalating foreclosure rates has meant thousand of cats and dogs are finding themselves homeless and dropped off at pounds or humane societies.

We are in the process of generating some unique fundraising ideas. We are exploring more grants. But those are all long range fixes. We need an immediate influx of donations.

Right now is when Planned Pethood and the services we offer are needed the most. In the past, you have trusted Planned Pethood to meet the needs of our community. In the past, you have made saving lives a reality though your generous donations of time, talent and money to PPI.

It is our sincere hope that you can help us in our dire time of need. You might not think your donation is enough- but it is. Every little bit counts and is hugely appreciated.

In the meantime, please keep PPI in your thoughts as we struggle to find the right way to address these grim realities.

Sheegwa is a young possible Himalayan mix cat. She was tossed outside to fend for herself in the bitter cold after her original owners no longer wanted her. Kind neighbors took her in and contacted Planned Pethood for help. She had one ear fall off immediately after arriving at the vets. Many people believe cats can fend for themselves if let go outside. Sheegwa's sad story shows that is not the case. Without the help of Planned Pethood rescuers, her story would have a much more tragic ending.

Unfortunately, she also tested positive for Feline Immunodeficiency Virus (FIV) which is the feline version of HIV/AIDS. With proper care, cats with FIV can have long lifespans.

She was named after the kitten on the PBS cartoon "Sagwa."

Sheegwa has had her second ear fall off because of frostbite damage and her nose has been frostbitten too.


# Can you Post Flyers Around Town?

# **Axel Recovering But Still Needs Help**

This big handsome boy was originally found as a stray by some children who kept him in a shed at their home because their parents didn't approve of them having him. He escaped from the shed and was hit by a car. They raised enough money for x-rays and pain meds and took him to an emergency vet. When the father came to pick Axel up, he threatened to shoot him when he got him home. The vet tech at the emergency clinic has seen many, many dogs over more than a decade of

working with animals, and saw something special in Axel. She wanted something more for him than such a heartless brutal end to his life and so she asked Planned Pethood for help.

Axel is recovering from a broken pelvis, a lacerated tongue, and a lot of scrapes and bruises. He is expected to make a full recovery after about 4 weeks of rest. We will keep you updated on his progress and let you know when he is available for adoption.

Axel is walking now! He is still only eating if I hand feed him since I think that his mouth still hurts, but he just licks my hand and licks my hand - so grateful for the attention!
