Take A Day at the Book Center

The book center at the 577 Foundation will be operated by Planned Pethood from July 1, 2011 to September 30, 2011. Through our volunteer efforts, we will receive 50% of the monies donated & 50% is contributed to Read For Literacy which helps hundreds of people learn to read. On Saturday, September 17 and Sunday, September 18 PPI will get 100% of the donations made.

Volunteers are asked to spend 60-90 minutes a week, on your appointed day to re-shelf books, sweep the floor and tidy up the book center. Your 60-90 minutes can be whenever you choose: morning, afternoon, evening; you decide.

We need someone every other day- at the least. We are hoping to have someone say they will take every Monday in those three months. Then someone who will take every Wednesday. And so on and so on. We will have a substitute on hand for the few days you might be out of town.

This is a great opportunity for a family looking to do something together, a retired person, a couple, a person looking for some quiet time, anyone!
